

Where To Watch Monday's Solar Eclipse With A Drink In Hand

The Great American Solar Eclipse happening on Monday, August 21st will be only [partially visible](#) to us in New York City, with only 71% of the sun covered by the moon in our area. But we'll throw a party for [just about any reason](#) and thus local bars, restaurants and venues are hosting viewing parties, often with some dining and drinking deals as further incentive. Hours of each party vary, but the eclipse will be viewable beginning at 1:23 p.m. and ending at 4 p.m., with the maximum eclipse occurring at the important hour of 2:44 p.m.

HAVEN ROOFTOP Rooftops are a natural fit for this kind of astronomical event, and Midtown's got a bunch of hotel rooftops like this one to get you a little closer to the action. The bar will be offering an Eclipse Negroni (\$14) made from gin that's been infused with cinnamon, Aperol, Campari and anise.
